We will seek to live carefully in the world, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, and remembering that, as we have been buried by baptism into the death of Christ and raised again from the grave with Him, so there is on us a special obligation to lead a new and holy life. *(Rom 6:1-11, Eph 5:15, Tit 2:12, 1 Thess 4:7, 1 Pet 1:13-25)*

We will work together for the continuance of a faithful Lutheran ministry in this church, as we sustain its worship, sacraments, preaching, discipline, and doctrines.
