Acts 4:32—5:11

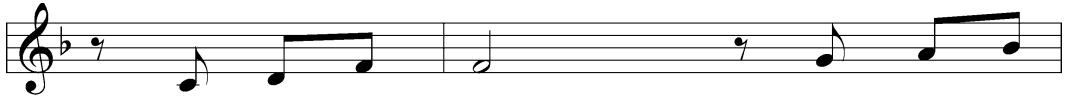

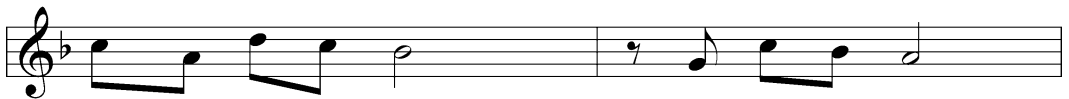

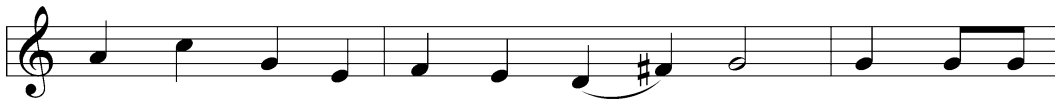
