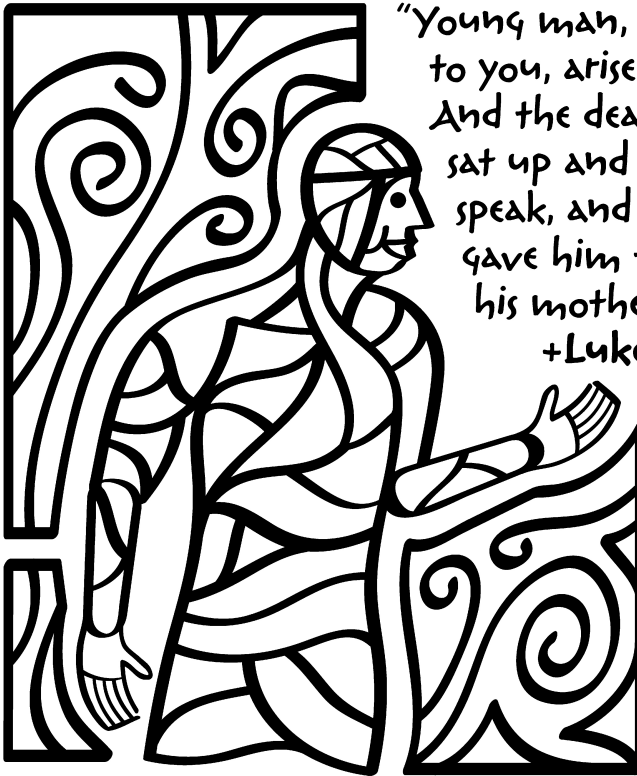

Second Reading

Acts 7:35–53

(Stephan has been brought before the Sanhedrin. He gives a long speech in which he recounts the history of God’s people. Abraham was called by God to go to the holy land and God told him that the Hebrews will be slaves in Egypt and then delivered. He recounts how the brothers of Joseph were jealous of him and sold him into slavery. Then he tells of Moses and how even Moses was rejected by some of the people.)

³⁵“This Moses whom they disowned, saying, ‘Who made you a ruler and a judge?’ is the one whom God sent *to be* both a ruler and a deliverer with the help of the angel who appeared to him in the thorn bush. ³⁶“This man led them out, performing wonders and signs in the land of Egypt and in the Red Sea and in the wilderness for forty years. ³⁷This is the Moses who said to the sons of Israel, ‘God will raise up for you a prophet like me from your brethren.’ ³⁸“This is the one who was in the congregation in the wilderness together with the angel who was speaking to him on Mount Sinai, and *who was* with our fathers; and he received living oracles to pass on to you. ³⁹“Our fathers were *unwilling* to be obedient to him, but repudiated him and in their hearts turned back to Egypt, ⁴⁰saying to Aaron, ‘Make for us gods who will go

before us; for this Moses who led us out of the land of Egypt- we do not know what happened to him.’⁴¹ “At that time they made a calf and brought a sacrifice to the idol, and were rejoicing in the works of their hands.⁴² “But God turned away and delivered them up to serve the host of heaven; as it is written in the book of the prophets, ‘It was not to Me that you offered victims and sacrifices forty years in the wilderness, was it, O house of Israel?⁴³ ‘You also took along the tabernacle of Moloch and the star of the god Rompha, the images which you made to worship. I also will remove you beyond Bablyon.’⁴⁴ “Our fathers had the tabernacle of testimony in the wilderness, just as He who spoke to Moses directed *him* to make it according to the pattern which he had seen.⁴⁵ And having received it in their turn, our fathers brought it in with Joshua upon dispossessing the nations whom God drove out before our fathers, until the time of David.⁴⁶ *David* found favor in God’s sight, and asked that he might find a dwelling place for the God of Jacob.⁴⁷ “But it was Solomon who built a house for Him.⁴⁸ “However, the Most High does not dwell in *houses* made by *human* hands; as the prophet says:⁴⁹ “Heaven is my throne, And earth is the footstool of My feet; What kind of house will you build for Me? says the Lord, ‘Or what place is there for My repose?’⁵⁰ Was it not My hand which made all these things?’

⁵¹ “You men who are stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears are always resisting the Holy Spirit; you are doing just as your fathers did.⁵² “Which one of the prophets did your fathers not persecute? They killed those who had previously announced the coming of the Righteous One, whose betrayers and murderers you have now become;⁵³ you who received the law as ordained by angels, and yet did not keep it.”

Luke 7:11–17

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the seventh chapter.

¹¹Soon afterward [Jesus] went to a town called Nain, and his disciples and a great crowd went with him. ¹²As he drew near to the gate of the town, behold, a man who had died was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow, and a considerable crowd from the town was with her. ¹³And when the Lord saw her, he had compassion on her and said to her, “Do not weep.” ¹⁴Then he came up and touched the bier, and the bearers stood still. 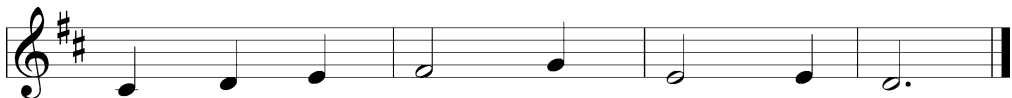

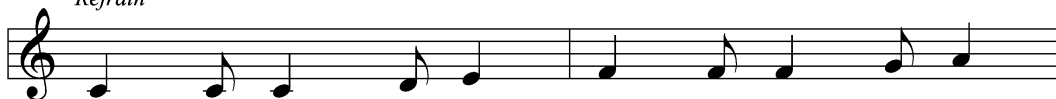

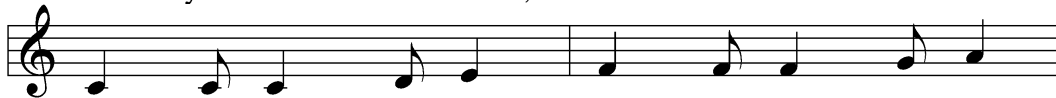
