
Communion Invitation


Dear Guest: If you are not a member of the Lutheran Church- Missouri Synod, please speak to pastor before taking the Lord's Supper.

And Moses said to them, "Why do you quarrel with me? 1 Corinthians 9:24—10:5




The Words of Our Lord


