
### **Communion Invitation**

#### Kneel/Stand


- C Almighty God, have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins, and lead us to everlasting life. Amen.

# Genesis 11:1–9

# Acts 2:1–21

<sup>1</sup>When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. <sup>2</sup>And suddenly there came from heaven a noise like a violent rushing wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup>And there appeared to them tongues as of fire distributing themselves, and they rested on each one of them. <sup>4</sup>And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit was giving them utterance.

<sup>5</sup>Now there were Jews living in Jerusalem, devout men from every nation under heaven. <sup>6</sup>And when this sound occurred, the crowd came together, and were bewildered because each one of them was hearing them speak in his own language. <sup>7</sup>They were amazed and astonished, saying, "Why, are not all these who are speaking Galileans? <sup>8</sup>And how is it that we each hear them in our own language to which we were born? <sup>9</sup>Parthians and Medes and Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, <sup>10</sup>Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya around Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes,<sup>11</sup> Cretans and Arabs—we hear them in our own tongues speaking of the mighty deeds of God." <sup>12</sup>And they all continued in amazement and great perplexity, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" <sup>13</sup>But others were mocking and saying, "They are full of sweet wine."

<sup>14</sup>But Peter, taking his stand with the eleven, raised his voice and declared to them: "Men of Judea and all you who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you and give heed to my words. <sup>15</sup>For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only the third hour of the day; <sup>16</sup> but this is what was spoken of through the prophet Joel:

'That I will pour forth of My Spirit on all mankind;

And your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,

And the moon into blood,


Before the great and glorious day of the Lord shall come.


# **Apostles' Creed**




# Preface


# The Words of Our Lord


