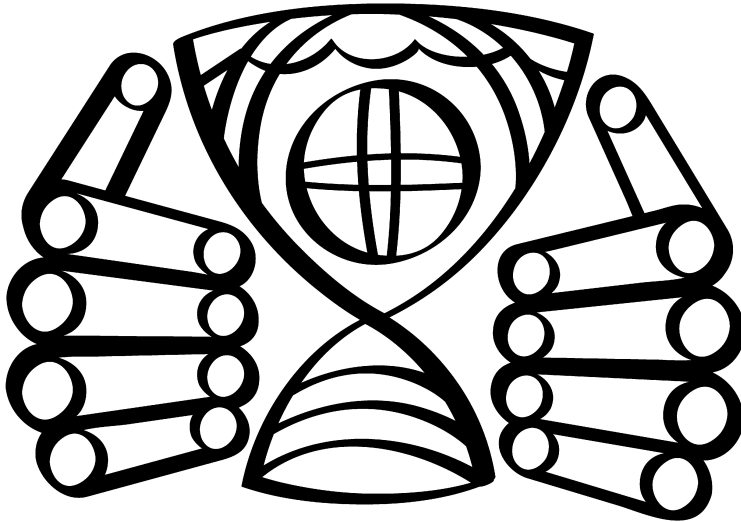

### Old Testament Reading (*LSB*)

*Leviticus 24:17-23*

17 'If a man strikes down the life of any human being, he shall surely be put to death. 18 And the one who strikes down the life of an animal shall make restitution for it, life for life. 19 If a man injures his neighbor, just as he has done, so it shall be done to him: 20 fracture for fracture, eye for eye, tooth for tooth; just as he has injured a man, so it shall be inflicted on him. 21 Thus the one who strikes down an animal shall make restitution for it, but the one who strikes down a man shall be put to death. 22 There shall be one

standard of judgment for you; it shall be for the sojourner as well as the native, for I am Yahweh your God.” 23 Then Moses spoke to the sons of Israel, and they brought the one who had cursed outside the camp and stoned him with stones. 

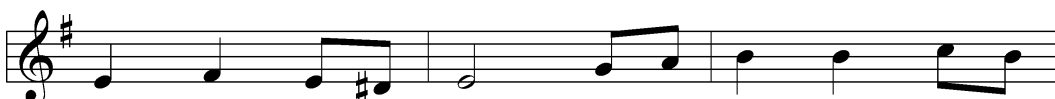
